October 7th COPAC meeting highlights:

**Transportation** - a survey will be sent to SD23 parents in the near future and parents will be notified so that everyone can fill it out, not just those who were adversely affected by bussing

SD23 websites - COPAC has heard from many parents that they can't find information on district or school websites. Parents are asked to forward comments to their PAC that will compile and forward on to COPAC. Issues will be reviewed with the IT Administrator and COPAC co-chairs within the next month.

Food programs - approx 2,500 district students are fed through breakfast programs, brown bag lunches and the backpack (weekend food) program. That is 10% of our students who receive extra sustenance to help with learning.

Operations funding - the new formula for school operations funding has not yet been announced by the BC government but both administrators and staff are

worried. Fun fact, BC public schools receive \$1,800 per student LESS in operations funding than the national average...
