- 2. Approval of the Minutes September 12, 2017; motion to accept by Darlene Kinakin/seconded by Shelley Hoffmann
- 3. Principal's Report Troy White
 - Enrollment update as of October 16th KSS has 1807 students
 - No room to create new classes but still room available within core classes
 - Thank you to the PAC for their support of the Lynn Lyons parent presentation on Anxiety and Depression; 287 parents attended the October 5th evening presentation.
 - Lynn Lyons also presented to 103 students, 12 teachers and 28 administrators earlier in the day and 450 teachers on October 6th during the SD23 Implementation Day.
 - The material presented by Lynn Lyons was extremely relevant to the implementation of our new curriculum and the core competencies.
 - Other speakers brought in for Implementation day included Geoff Fabian "What was your win today" and Dr. Peter Arthur who spoke on growth and fixed mindsets.
 - Parents should be receiving communication/interim reports from their student's teachers this week prior to Parent Teacher Interviews
 - KSS Parent Teacher Interviews are Wed September 18th from 4:30-6:30pm. Unfortunately there is a conflict with both Dr. Knox and KLO Parent Teacher interviews on the same night. This has been corrected for next year!
 - Fire Drills/Emergency Drills/Lock down drills are underway and will all be completed by the end of October. Students and staff are taking these very seriously.
 - Teacher Professional Development day this Friday October 20th; no school for students
 - Looking for parent input/support of proposed outdoor basketball court w/6 basketball hoops. Proposed location is the gravel area between Raymer Ave and the last portable. Cost is approximately \$38,000.00.
 - Parents felt this was an excellent idea/enhancement of the KSS school property. It
 would not only solve problems for students wanting to practice when the gym is not
 available but would also encourage students to be active before, after and in between
 their regular classes. All parents in favour of proceeding and offered their full support!
