- 1. SD 23 Budget Presentation by Delta Carmichael CPA and Kate Cumming CPA This budget provides an overall picture of the school district and provides a budget based on future projections of changes in the SD. A few highlights:
  - Grad rate 96% higher than provincial average
  - FTE = 8 courses and drives budget
  - 49 school sites and 24,708 students
  - International students bring in \$6,235,000; 430 students
  - Portables still needed comes out of SD budget: new portable \$350,000, used \$100,000. This year we need 5 portables: 3 new, 2 used.
  - 122 portables presently
  - SD at 106% capacity
  - A survey has been sent out about the budget, so check your emails
- 2. Trustee Update by Amy Geistlinger
  - Revision to Indigenous Arts course sent to the ministry for approval
- 3. CUPE Report ratified tentative collective agreement

- 4. COPAC organizing a speakers event: ADHD expert Dan Duncan (still deciding on the dates, so keep an eye open for this.)
- 5. COPAC survey on Impact of PACs. Looking at what funding PACs bring into each school.
